## WATER AND WASTEWATER REPORTS FOR DECEMBER 2023

### Drinking Water

- 5,895,000 gals produced and treated with Chlorine and Fluoride for an average Free Chlorine residual of 0.77mg/L, Fluoride residual of 0.96mg/L, and Iron residual of 0.03mg/L after filtering.
- No violations in the treatment or distribution of the City of Manchester drinking water.

### Wastewater

- 8,935,000 gals treated and discharged to the River Raisin.
- All treated sewage tested within the MI-EGLE permitted values with no violations.
